 available on Wednesday. Find a quiet spot and reflect, ponder and commune with God.
- On Christmas Eve our worship will be celebrative with scripture, carols, and various folks providing special music. Especially for this service I need your help. I need a picture of you and your family holding a lit candle. I'm seeking to use these photos in our Christmas Eve liturgy. These can be sent by email, dropped off at the church, text them to me at 952-4351, or pony express. In order to include these in our service I must have these by December 10.

Our First Sunday of Advent last Sunday was the foundational sermon on our Advent Theme "My Heart Shall Sing of the Day You Bring." I'm hearing some people beginning to hum. The key for me it is not a lament, but a canticle of joyful praise. Let us work together and make a difficult time the best Advent and Christmas experience!

Summary of the Annual Meeting November 15th, 2020

10: 35 a.m. Meeting opened with devotions led by Pastor David Lambertson

Council Vice President and Meeting Chairperson Karen Baken called the meeting to order

Determination of quorum and introduction of parliamentarian Chris Svendsen. At least 71 members were observed in attendance.

Laura Hahn (Covid-19 Committee Chair With the recent spike in Covid-19 cases, the Covid-19 Advisory Committee recommends that do not worship in-person at this time.

Interim Pastor Kathleen Anderson's introduction video was shown. Pastor Kathleen is looking forward to being with us and to be back in Washington.

Parliamentarian Chris S. noted that if no dissent was voiced by the members in attendance after the request of the chairperson, adoption of measures and approval of nominees could be made by "General Consent" instead of written ballot, per section 48 of the Robertson Rules of Order.




