I look forward to seeing you there!



During the Easter season (50 days between the Resurrection of our Lord and the Day of Pentecost), the Worship Committee is offering a second worship service at 11:00 a.m.

This worship service is intended to be more like the 4:00 p.m. service on Sunday afternoon—more family oriented and less formal than the 9:00 a.m. service. For those who attended the 4:00 p.m. service, you probably remember that a certain level of energy and impetus was lost when Tim Schulz was forced by his health to end his participation at 4:00 p.m. Bart will be with us now, spurring us forward with music and song, just like Tim did, but minus the ukulele. Communion will be offered every Sunday at this service. We hope to be able to offer some kind of food and fellowship in the narthex every Sunday, too, although the status of that is as yet tenuous. If you're interested in bringing food for all to enjoy, you could help move its status from tenuous to definite. In our council meeting opening devotions we were reminded that "God promises to turn darkness into Light". We have certainly seen this happening recently. Changes in covid restrictions have finally allowed our congregation to come together in worship as we did two years

ago. Masks are no longer required to be worn, but may be if you like.

On March 13th our church service included the Passing of the Peace after an absence of nearly two years. I recall a Sunday nearly 40 years ago when my family walked into CLC for the first time. My previous life-long Lutheran worship did not include the Passing of the Peace. It was a very special moment for me to share in this fellowship, and I will never forget it.

CLC now has a new music director, Bart Roderick, and this has allowed us to enjoy the CLC Choir for the first time on March 20th. We welcome Bart and his musical talents to our services.

The replacement of electrical wires in the sanctuary is complete and the pews are back in place for worship. Records of Attendance and hand sanitizers will be back in the pews.

The call committee has obtained the names of two pastoral candidates from the synod. On-line interviews will occur in the near future.

Pastor Kathleen will present a new member class between April 24th and May 29th. It will be called "Lutheran 101" and all members are welcome to attend as a "refresher" course. The classes will be held between Sunday services.

Seven CLC members helped Habitat for Humanity built a new home at 24th Avenue and Mead. In the space of a week they covered all of the walls with plaster board, caulked, and painted the exterior of the house. They also enjoyed pizza lunch on one day and El Porton food on another. It is a great feeling to know that someone will soon have a new house to all home. You can help too; call HFH at 453-8077 to volunteer.





CARING FOR CREATION

Previous issues of the Messenger enumerated problems of plastics, but wait there is more.....

Do you know that micro-plastics are now being detected in human blood of 80% of people tested?

Micro-plastics are detected from the Summit of Mt. Everest to the depths of our deepest oceans.

As air pollution particles have been proven to enter our bodies and cause millions of premature death each year, it is assumed that the presence in our bodies of micro-plastics will prove to be a detriment to our health, as well.

Micro-plastics are actually 10X more prevalent in the feces of babies, than in that of adults.

Humans are getting these plastics from the air we breathe, the water we drink, as well as the food we eat.

There are three types of sources of these micro-plastics. Half of those tested had the variety of plastic that are common in drink bottles.

One third of those tested had micro-plastics that originated in food packaging, and

One fourth of those tested had micro-plastics of polyethylene, which is from plastic bags.

What can you do?

Reduce your purchase selections to eliminate as much plastic as you can. For plastic that you do purchase try to find ways to reuse the plastic bottles, bags, or other containers so they do not go in the landfill, or even in the recycling container where many plastics only are transferred to the landfill anyway. Remember a small percentage of plastic put in recycling is actually recycled.
