

May Christ continue to bless and maintain congregations like Central Lutheran, who keep the flame alive by serving the most vulnerable in our community.





More on the Super Powers of Trees...

Planting a tree can help the environmentally in so many ways, some of which include:

*Trees can prevent water pollution, just like they can help prevent air pollution. Storm water can contain phosphorus, and nitrogen which can flow into natural water sources like rivers, streams, lakes and oceans. Trees break the fall of rain to the earth, and allow more water to seep into the soil rather than in a direct run off to storm drains. Moving through the soil can cleanse water via physical, chemical and biological processes. * Trees boost biodiversity and provide food sources and natural habitat for wildlife. One apple tree, for example, can produce about 20 bushels of apples which can nourish many birds, insects, and wildlife....or humans.

*Trees reinforce the soil by reducing erosion, increase fertility, and help the soil retain moisture. Fallen tree leaves reduce soil temperature and thus limit water evaporation. These leaves can decay to promote the development of microorganisms which increase soil fertility and health.

* A mature acre of trees can produce enough oxygen in a year for 18 people.

Planting a tree can do all these good things, plus they can be a beautiful addition to your landscape.
