Confirmation begins Sunday, September 24<sup>th</sup>, at Central Lutheran. If you or someone you know has a child age 6<sup>th</sup> grade and up who would like to be part of this year's Confirmation class, please extend them the invitation to join! Confirmation is an important milestone in a young person's life that should not be side-stepped. ## **Church in Society:**



Caring for Creation: Watering our Yards & Gardens Watering our yards and gardens uses a very precious commodity-WATER! Short of Zero-scaping, if you find you need to keep landscape plants and grass watered, at least do it most effectively.

DO water in the early morning hours, between 4-8am, when water is least likely to evaporate.

DO use drip irrigation as much as possible. Soaker hoses are an easy and low-tech way to water gardens. Water can be most effectively applied to root areas, and the slow delivery method matches the ability of roots to absorb the water. Water savings can be as high as 80%. There is less evaporation and less dispersal of water to extraneous areas where weeds may be waiting to germinate.

DO water 3x/week in the spring and summer, only 2x/week in the fall, or even more ideally, only water when soil is actually dry!

DON'T use sprinklers with fine spray as this water is most susceptible to both evaporation and to wind drift. DON'T water mid-day, between 10am-4pm. This results in the most evaporation and the least effective use of the 12 gallons/min. average that sprinklers put out.

We need to try to care for creation while we are caring for our lawns and gardens. Use water conscientiously!




### Camp Hope July




Thank you to everyone who brought cookies and bars for Virginia Prochnow's memorial reception. Thanks, also to the workers and Lea and Manny for doing the setup.
